This course covers history, religion, culture and politics. Discussions focus on such critical issues as weapons of mass destruction, organized crimes, the Balkan Conflict, and the future of U.S. Military and SOF in the region. Provides background information and effective strategies for cross-cultural communication to enhance interaction and analytical skills.	
OBJECTIVE:	To provide an introduction to historical and political dynamics as well as cultural and religious character of the region of Russia, Central Europe, and Central Asia. Develops a foundation for application of regional information that will allow for more effective planning and execution of theater-specific military operations
